

# **Municipal Cities in Dekalb - Elections**

**City council members** influence local governance by making decisions on policies, budgets, and regulations that shape their community. Their influence varies by city size and structure, but they generally act as a legislative body, working with a mayor or city manager to execute policies. They don't typically manage daily operations but set the broader direction for the city.

Their key areas of impact include:

- **Budget and Finances**: Approving the city's budget, allocating funds for public services like parks, libraries, and infrastructure, and setting local taxes or fees.
- **Zoning and Land Use:** Regulating development through zoning laws, approving or denying construction projects, and shaping urban planning.
- **Public Services:** Overseeing services like police, fire departments, public transportation, and waste management, ensuring they meet community needs.
- Local Laws and Ordinances: Enacting rules on issues like noise, parking, business operations, or housing standards.
- **Community Programs**: Supporting initiatives for housing, economic development, environmental sustainability, or public health.
- \*\* Infrastructure: Approving projects like road repairs, public buildings, or utilities to improve city functionality.
- **Public Safety:** Setting policies for law enforcement and emergency services, balancing safety with community concerns.
- **Community Engagement:** Representing constituents, addressing their concerns, and incorporating public input into decisions.






